Tires - you know those black round things that are in between your multi-ton thing you call a motor home and the road. They do their job well in most cases and help us move along the road relatively smoothly and comfortably. I hear a lot of questions about tires when talking to many of you at rallies and campgrounds. There are many answers and some appear to be conflicting.

The first thing that is thought about generally is the tire pressure. How much should you run in your tires? The only way to be sure you have the correct pressure is to weigh each tire separately. You should then look at the maximum tire weight on an axle and use that number to look up the required pressure in the manufacturer's chart for your tires. The pressure given in the charts is a cold tire pressure.



sure. You should check the pressure on the tires when the tires are cold - not after running all day. It's not unusual to have different pressures on each axle of the coach, but each axle should have the same pressure on all tires on that axle.

Another item often discussed with varied opinions is tire age. There is a stamp on the tires that gives the date the tire was actually manufactured. Different manufactures have different recommendations on the number of years a tire should be in service, but "newer the better: is always the way to go. Goodyear doesn't include any specific time frame in the RV Tire brochure, but the timeframe three to five years has been mentioned several times by Goodyear representatives at MI rallies. Michelin recommends that any tire older than ten years be removed from service regardless. They also recommend that any tire older than five years have regular inspections by a Michelin dealer annually for a determination of whether they should be taken out of service or not. They even have a card which an owner can use to visually inspect the tires yourself for aging, weather checking or ozone cracking.

Another item discussed is storing a motor home. Michelin mentions this in their brochure and states that you should always place a moisture barrier (cardboard, plastic or plywood) between the tires and the storage surface. They also mention that you should cover the tires to block direct sunlight and ultraviolet rays.

The links http://www.goodyear.com/rv/ allow you to download a guide that shows everything mentioned in this article and more. These are good documents to help answer some of your questions. When in doubt you should always ask your authorized tire dealer for your brand of tires.
